We are the first point of contact for students, parents, community partners, providing support for administrators, teachers and other support staff, to ensure the best learning environment possible in Bluewater.

Office Professionals ensure the safe arrival and departure of every student. We are the liaison between bus companies, parents and students. Office Professionals take their role very seriously in assisting with the safety of Bluewater District School Board students.

Staff in central administration offices work behind the scenes to support the education system. Student records. ministry reporting, and teacher/employee administrative systems are dependent on the expertise of these team members.

Technicians install and maintain a high-speed, wide area network that connects all Bluewater work sites as well as being responsible for installation and maintenance of central systems.

Who Is OSSTF

Welcome to OSSTF, the only union in Ontario that includes public secondary school teachers and educational workers.

Answers to questions, Help and Assistance when you need it. Membership in OSSTF brings you the support and assistance of members in all sectors of the educational system. This extends from your co-workers in the school or workplace to those in the bargaining unit, district and provincial office.

Rights:

OSSTF members have all of the democratic and human rights of Canadian citizens and union members. Some key professional rights featured in the OSSTF constitution include:

- The right to participate in the union
- The right to fair and equitable treatment from employers
- The right to fair evaluation
- The right to fair representation by the union

Responsibilities:

OSSTF members must

- comply with the constitution, bylaws and policies of OSSTF
- uphold the OSSTF pledge and statement of ethics
- act in accordance with the Principles of Professional Conduct
- support their negotiators and participate in all strike activities voted on by the majority of members
- on making an adverse report on another member, give that member a copy within 3 days (except for reporting suspected child abuse under the Child and Family Services Act).
